After my visit to Kenya I had to ask myself what would we give to have our Churches filled with a group like this on Sunday Morning. At the New Hope Preparatory School, students are required to have religious

teachings at least one day a week according to Kenyan law. With the expansion underway and now 2/3 completed, attendance is now up to 600 students. This picture is only half the classes because of lack of space to get them all in once session. Sister Sarah Olonde began with a dozen students that could not learn because of hunger. She began to feed what she could and prayed, and prayed some more. The New Hope Missionary Baptist Church provides God Called Preachers to instruct, teach and preach to these 600 children, most of them and their families are lost. If the third floor construction and bathrooms can be completed, it is anticipated that there will be 1,000 children at the school. In addition, on Sunday Mornings, parents, children, neighbors pour into the new auditorium for worship at the new mission. If you or your church gives to the Kenya Fund, I thank you for your efforts. We were saddened to learn of the death of Brother Larry Galloway this week. He had a troubled life for the past several years but has now gone to be with the Lord. His suffering is over.

This week marks the 239th anniversary of the Declaration Of Independence. Unfortunately many people have come to believe it means we are free from any responsibility to check our desires and acknowledge sin.

Thomas Jefferson was the architect of the Declaration. Later he was ambassador to France when the U. S. Constitution was written and had no input into its content. His greatest concern of the new governing document was the power of the Supreme Court. Jefferson saw the possibility that the court could become a dictatorial group instead of a ruling panel for the interpretation of the law. Gradually since the 1950's his concern has come to fruition.

Friday, the Supreme Court released its decision on homosexual marriage. This declares all states in the Union must allow the marriage of same sex couples. This constitutes the formulation of a law without the consent of the people, thereby, taking Congress out of the law making business. Congress is the representative branch of the government for the people of our country. Along with the increasing use of executive orders from the President and the dictatorial making of law by the Supreme Court, the will of the people and rights of states to govern those things not expressly contained in the Constitution for oversight by the federal government has been greatly diminished.

This is a sad time for our nation and the world. Even greater challenges are ahead; as this ruling will open the flood gates of many more immoral demands to be recognized as acceptable and legal. The Bible tells us "they" will declare good to be evil and evil to be good. God help us that would hold to the truth of His word, for His judgment will be on our nation.

Larry Galloway - taken from the salvation experience written for Faith MBC

I was nine years old when I was saved. It was the last Sunday of July in 1969, about 7:00 p.m. I don't remember what the sermons were about, but after going to every revival service for three years, I finally got serious with God and Jesus. I had a vision where I was on top of a tall mountain and God spoke to me, directing me to step out in faith and to physically jump off, and that God would catch me in His powerful Hand and would lift me up and save me and forgive me of my sins. I now know that this was spiritual faith/belief exercise, and I praise God for His wonderful salvation! I was saved on the altar at Old Union Missionary Baptist Church in Warren County, KY. I usually sat in the choir loft and sang during the song service. Then, when the invitation to sinners was given to come to the altar and seek my salvation, I would walk down out of the choir and go to the altar. That Sunday night I didn't immediately recognize that I was saved. I doubted my salvation because the devil told me I could NOT have been saved because basically nothing happened. I didn't see a great light or angels or hear music, or anything. But praise God, finally on Thursday night Jesus broke through and showed me that I was saved! I was in the choir singing as usual when the preacher gave the sinner's invitation. But that night they were singing, "When the Roll is Called Up Yonder, I'll Be There!" And suddenly I knew in my heart that(yes!) I was on my way to Heaven! I didn't have to come down and go to the altar again, because I had been saved! I started shouting and praising Jesus because I knew I was saved!
