Today I want to focus on the purpose for Jesus coming into the world. Following is an article I found several years ago (edited for space).

Do We Understand?

While President Harry S. Truman was in office, an attempt was made to assassinate him. Endeavoring to protect the President, a guard was slain. With deep sadness, the President commented, "You can't understand how a man feels when somebody else dies for him".

I would think, after such an experience, the remainder of life would become very special. Without the self-sacrifice of that guard, the President would not have those remaining years of his life. Each day would seem very precious having been purchased for him by the shedding of another man's blood.

Thinking of the cross we may all too casually utter the words, "He died for me". Do you see the suffering Saviour dying as the sacrifice for the world, the whole human race, much more than we see it as being for any one of us in particular?

In the old spiritual, "Were You There?", some meaningful questions are asked. It asks if you saw Him crucified, nailed to the cross; did you see the earth plunged into darkness when the sun refused to shine; did you see Him laid in the tomb? Such contemplation of soul "cause me to tremble, tremble, tremble", as the song goes.

Once we are gripped by the sight of Him who "there on the cross was wounded for me", the remainder of life takes on a new and different meaning.
